- In order to make possible the comparison between the two surveys, the questionnaire used in 2004 is very close to the last one used in 1995:

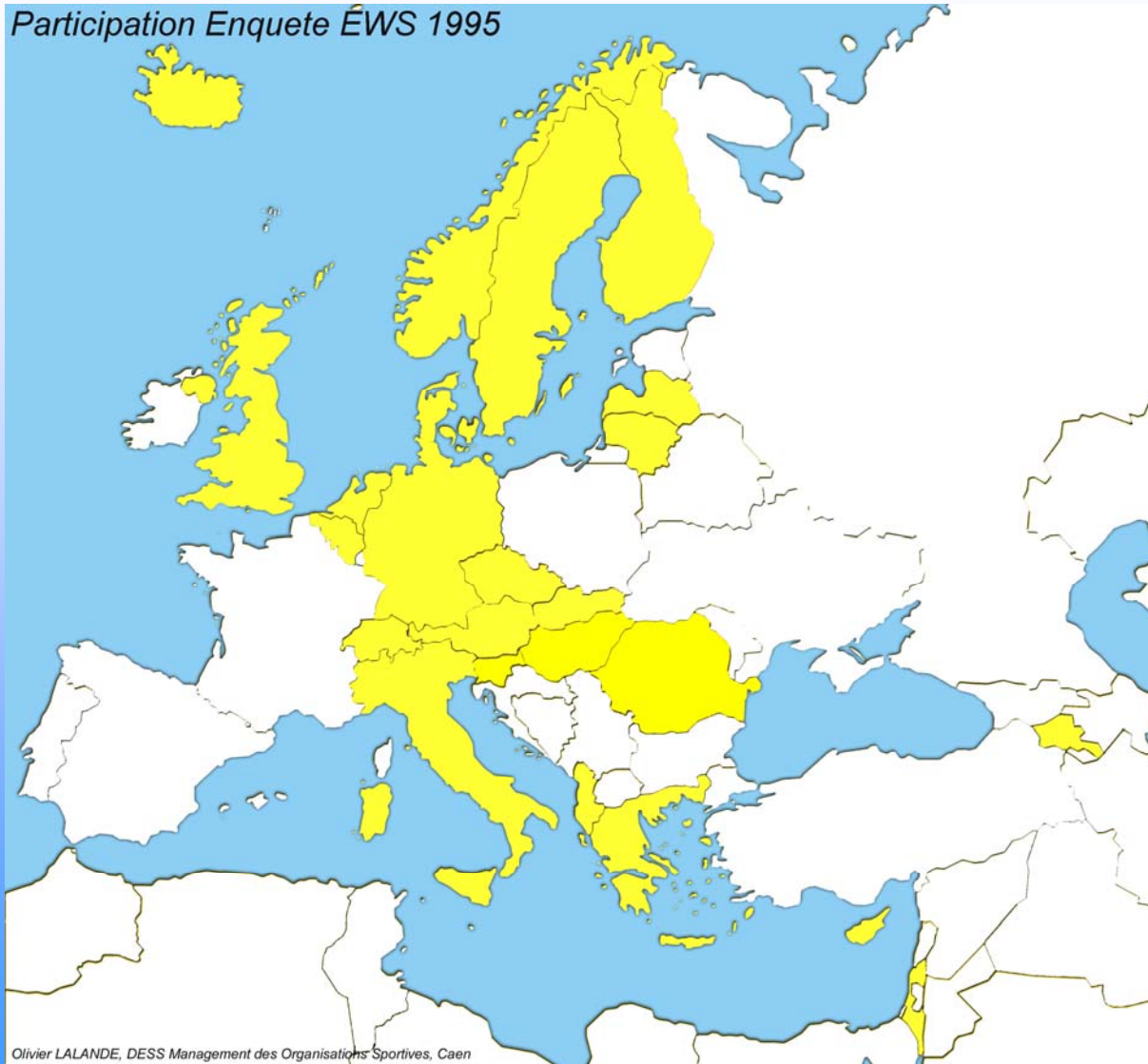


- This presentation will show successively:

 - suggesting an evolution of the next questionnaire.

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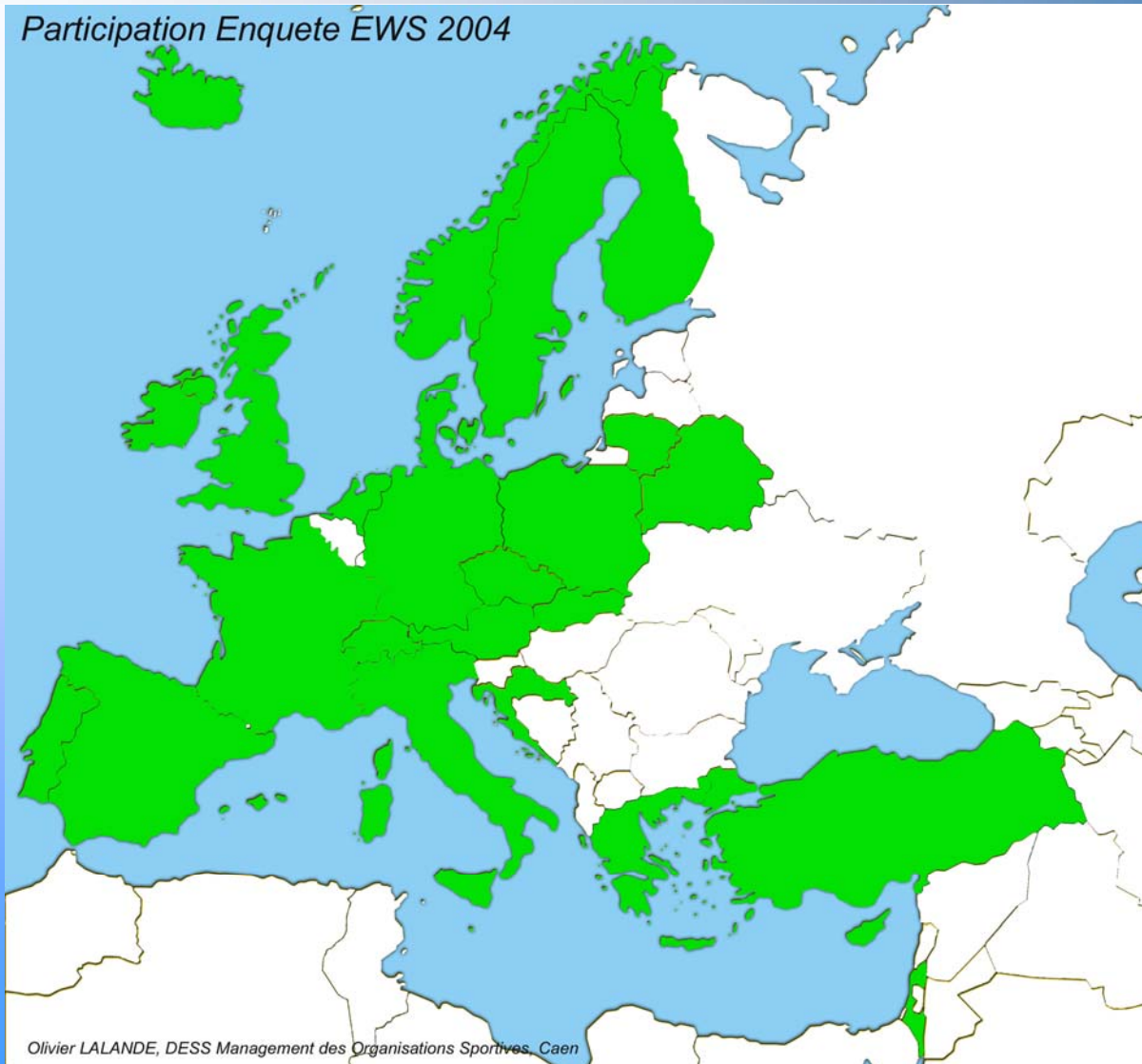

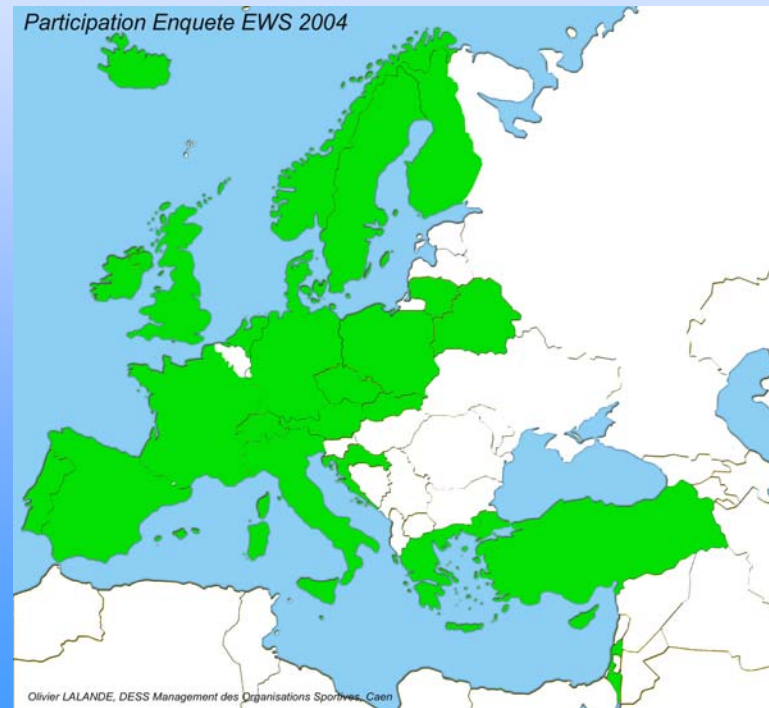
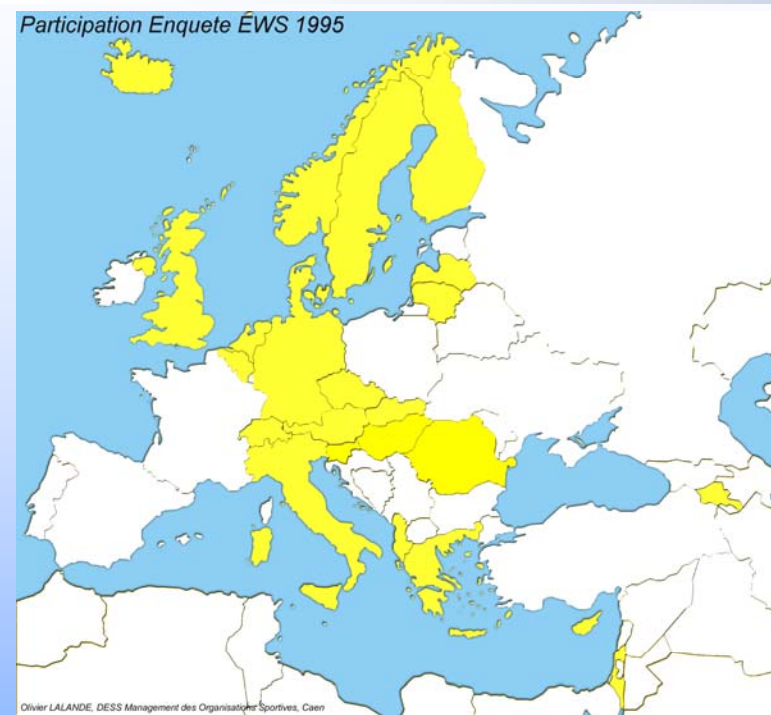

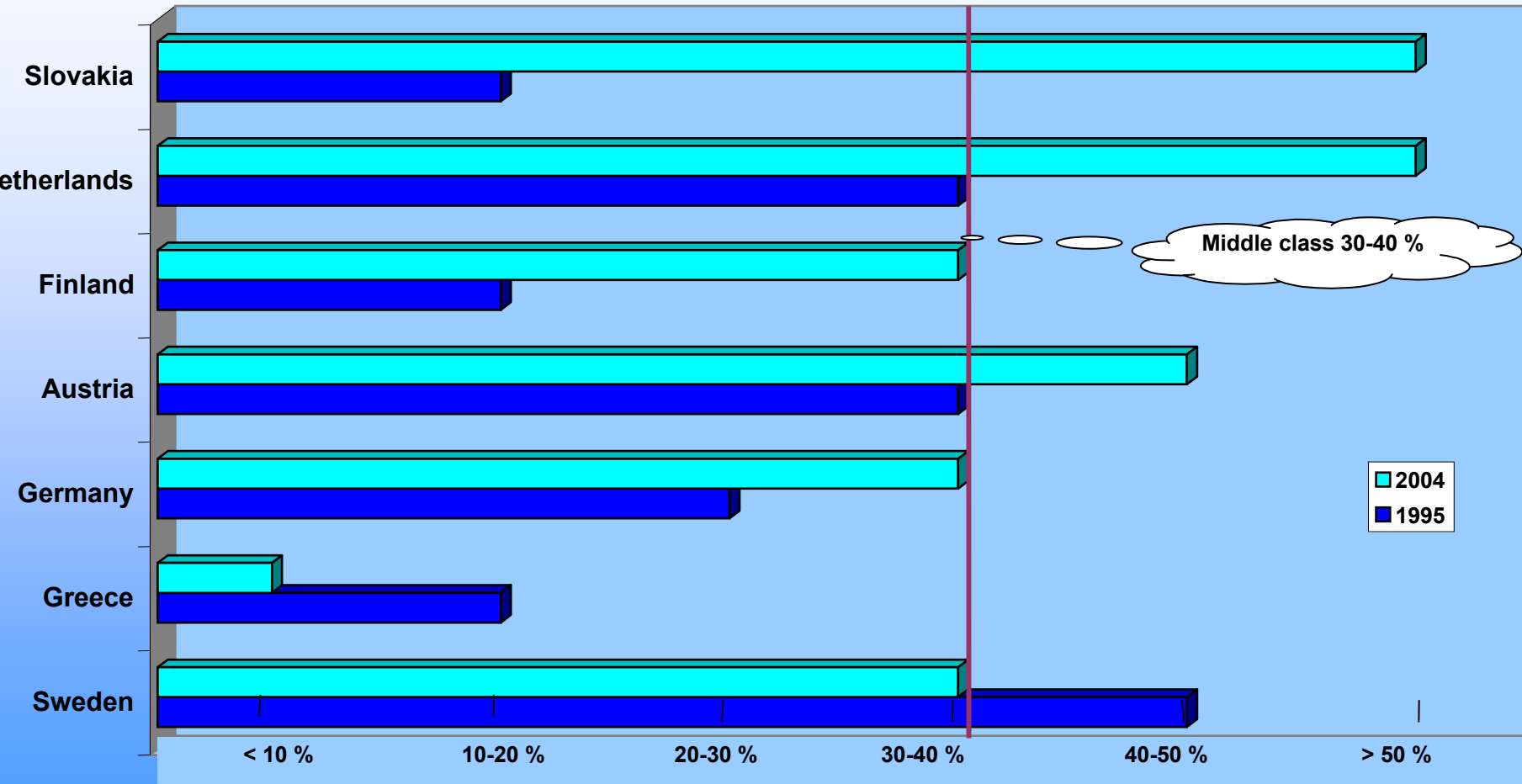


Percentage of female members in all sport organizations by country.

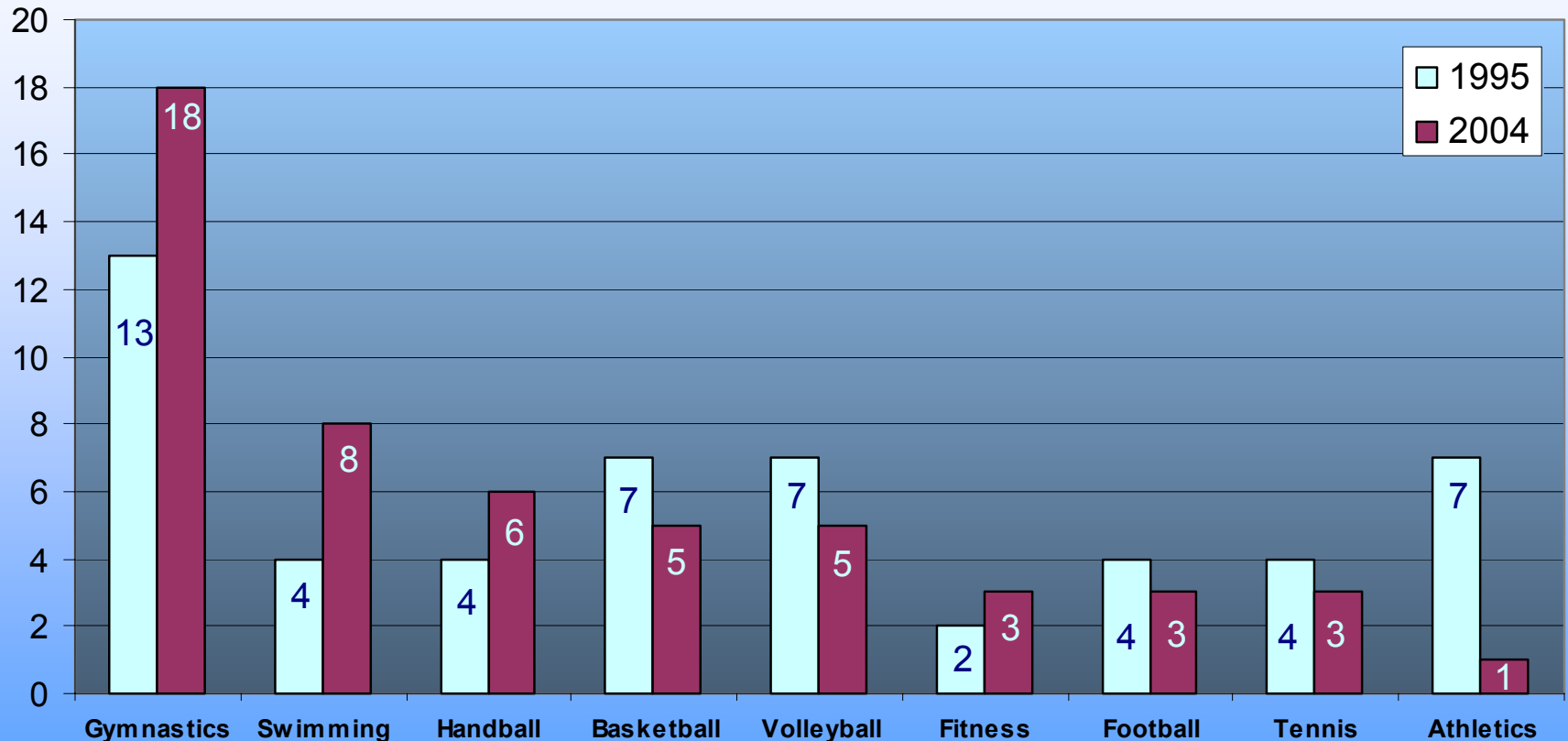


Evolution of percentage of female members in seven countries.





The most popular sport in European countries in 1995 and 2004

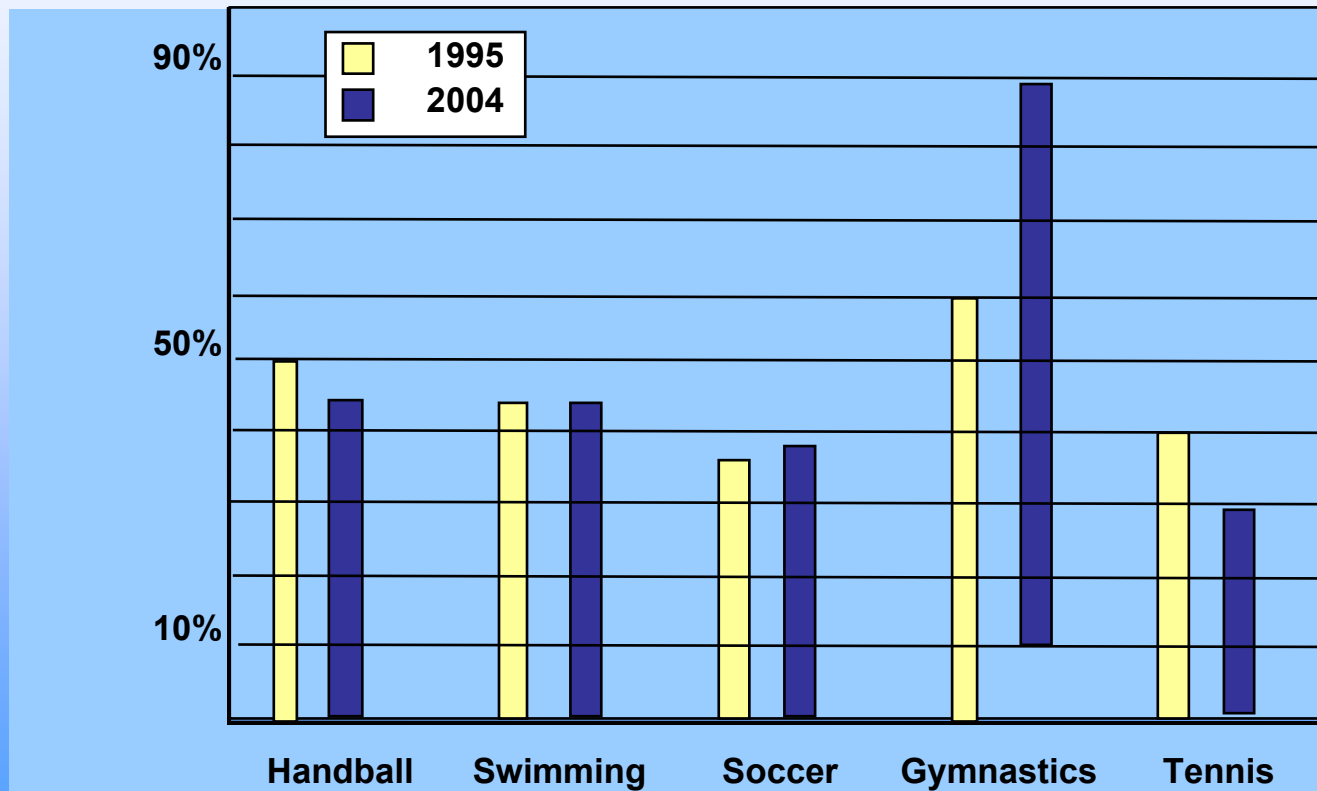


Gymnastics is mentioned by 18 countries in 2004 (13 in 1995) among the three most important sports for women

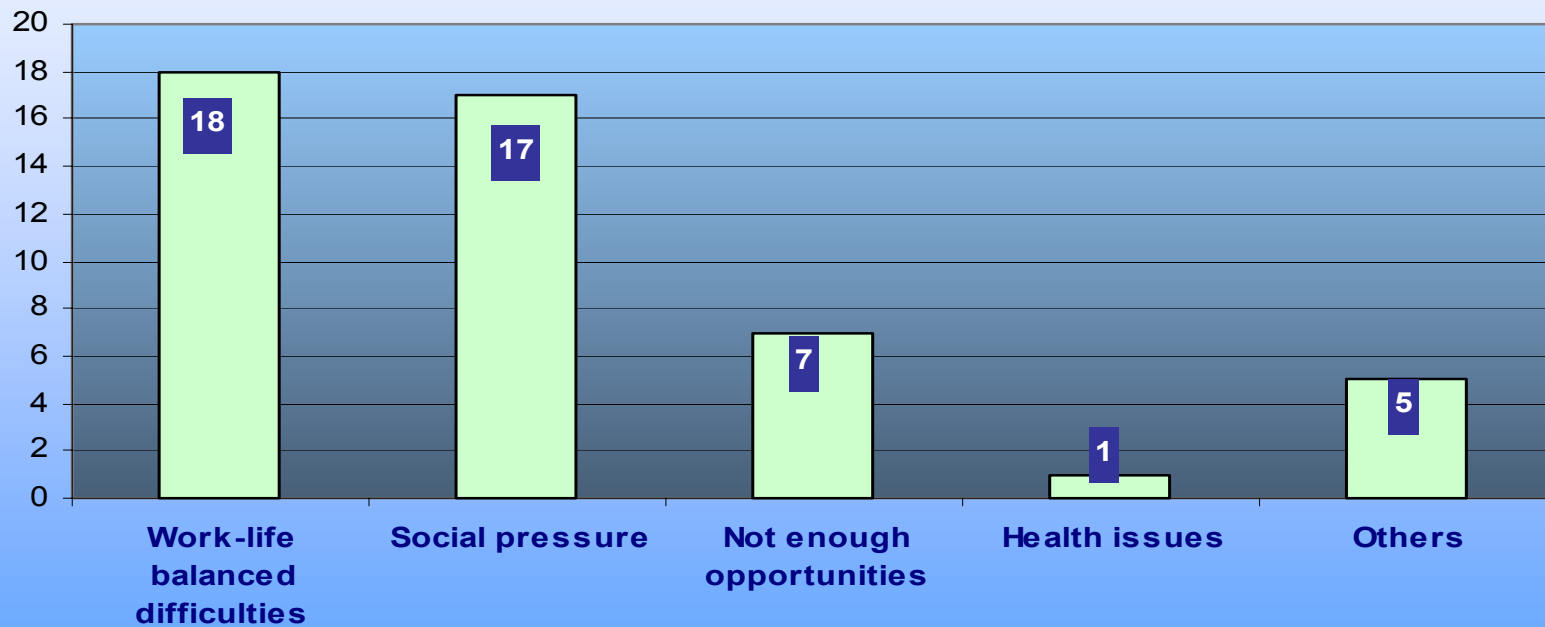

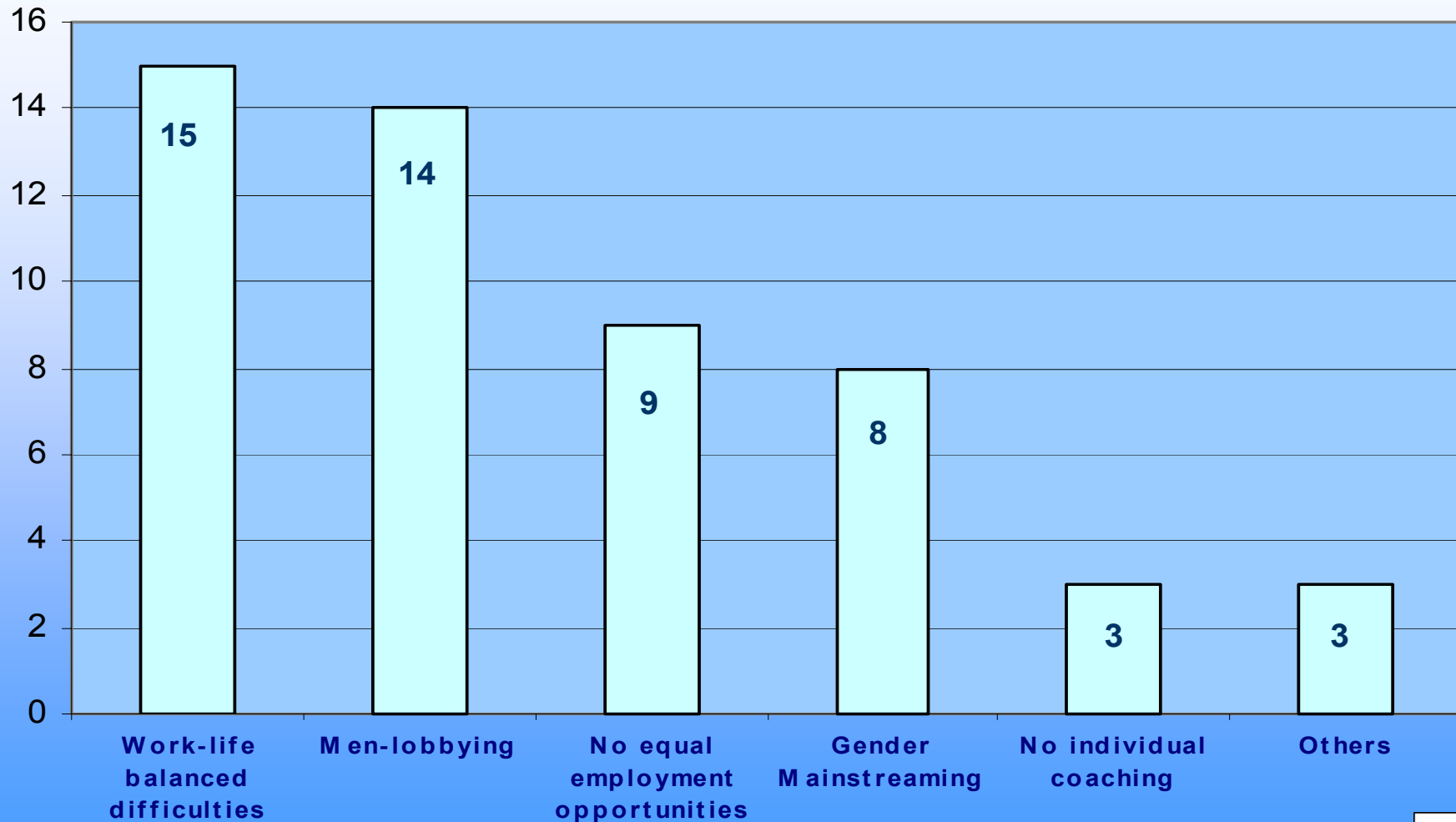


Barriers in sport's access for women - 2004

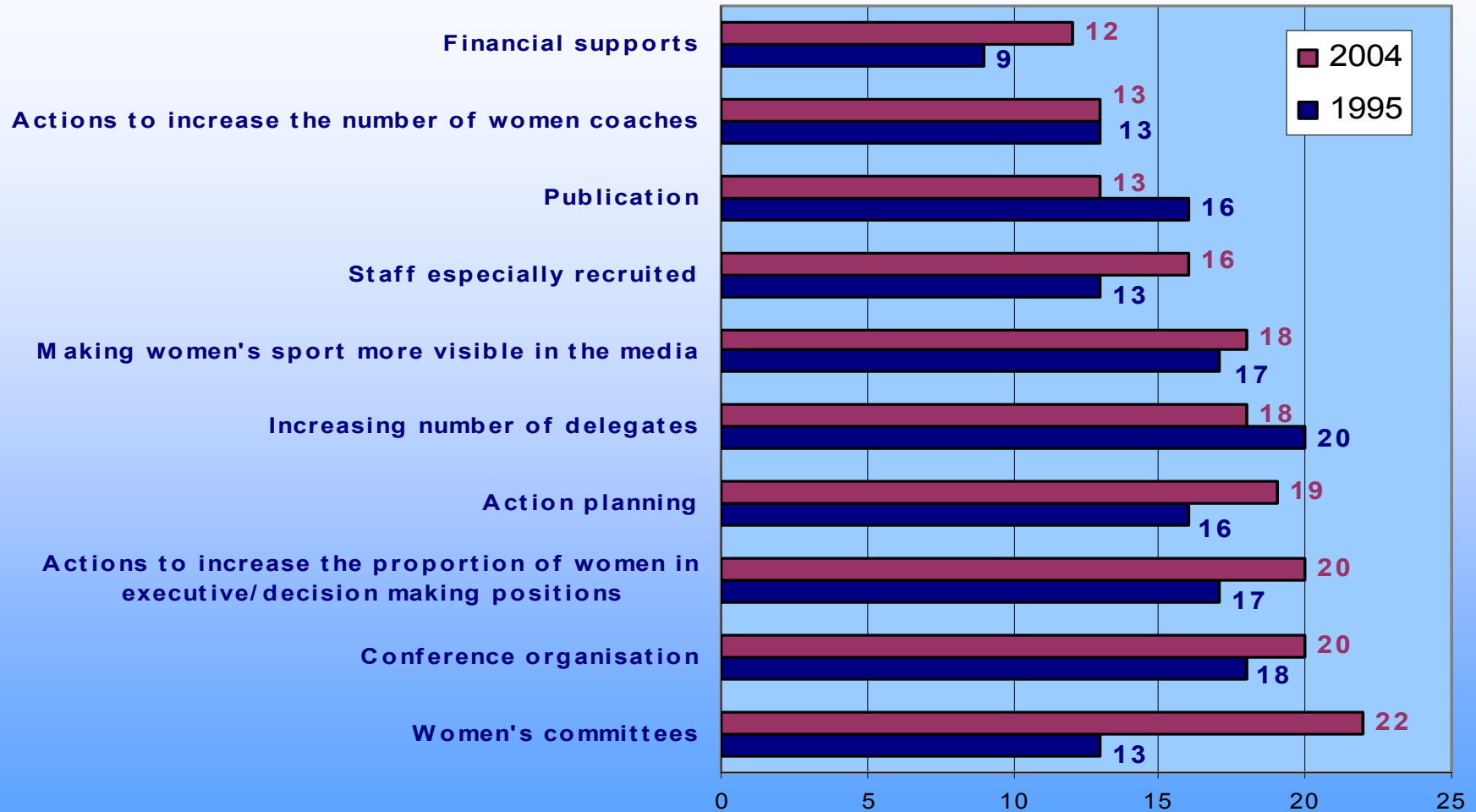




Barriers to access to decision-making positions - 2004



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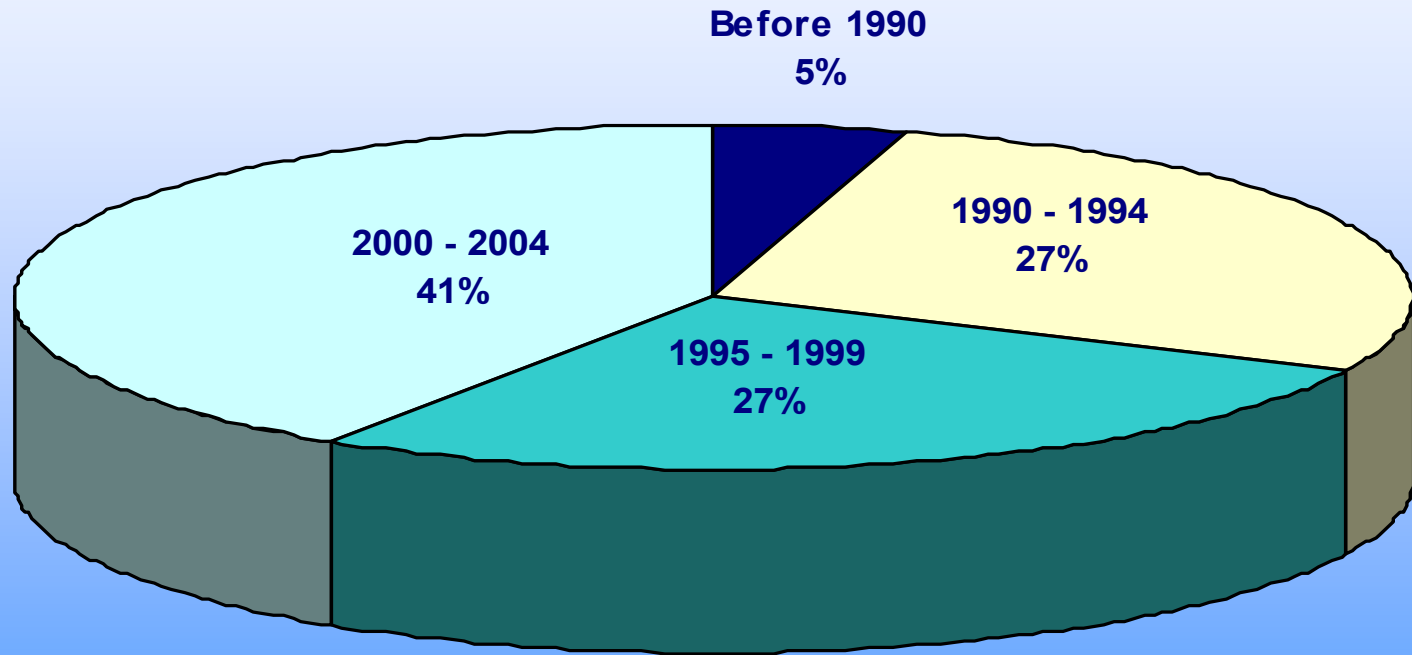


22 countries among 26 have a women 's committee in 2004

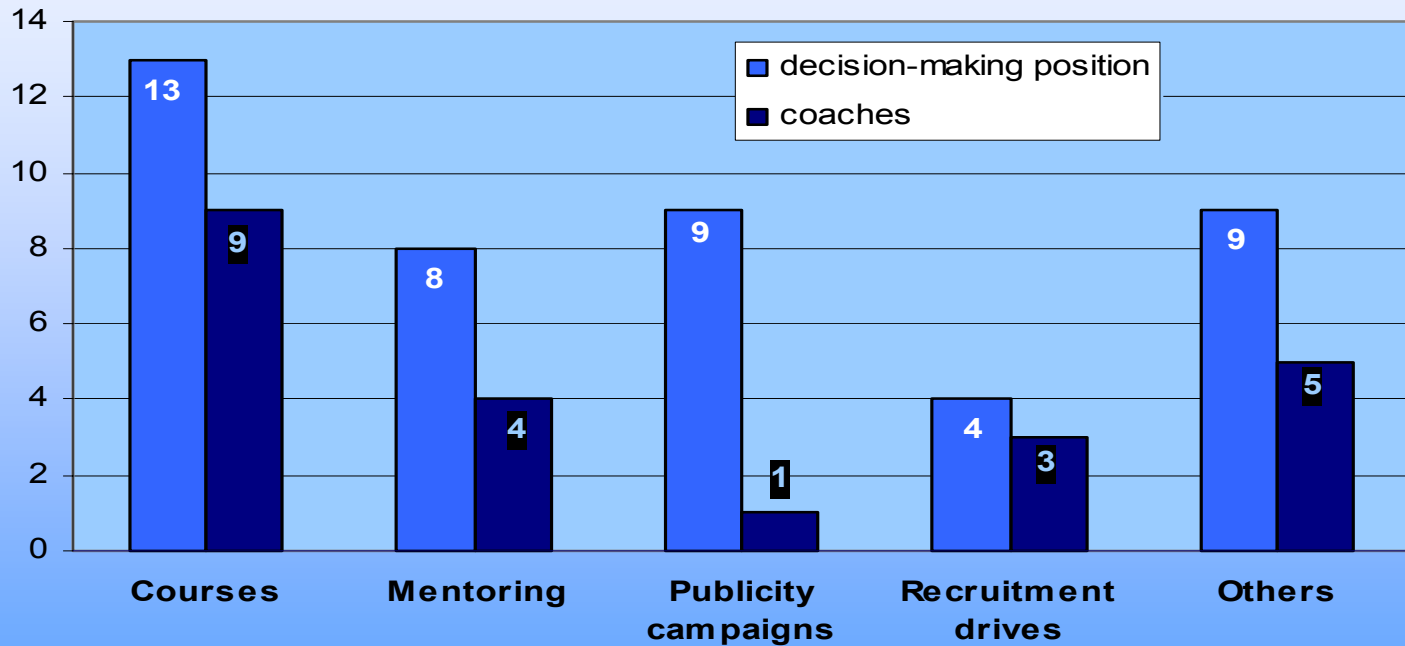
Women 's committee -Year of creation

- In 2004, countries the most active are Lithuania, Great Britain and Norway

- In 1995, they were Netherlands, Norway, Great Britain

- the best evolution: Finland followed by Lithuania and Cyprus

- the biggest slowing down: Germany, Denmark and Italy
